GREETINGS FROM THE DISTRICT MANAGER

I hope everyone is enjoying the Holiday Season. We would like to update our residents' records to ensure they are

accurate. If you have an emotional support animal or a but here we are! HPARC is busy getting ready for another service animal, please contact the office and we can update great year. We are always looking for new faces and fresh your records. We are in the process of contacting these pet owners. There is an annual fee of 50.00 for recertification.

Please be aware that our ACC Rules and Deed Restrictions state you have 90 days from the date of a Hurricane to fix your property. The deadline is 1-9-2025.

We have been inspecting homes for overgrown weeds and mold. Please see the Deed Restriction below:

3(p)All flower beds, planting areas, gutters and similar areas on all lots must be kept free of weeds and overgrowth. Lot owners are responsible for removal of mold or mildew from their home and lot including, awnings, shutters, shed, roof, and driveway. Shrubs and trees must be pruned when needed. Dead shrubs and limbs must be removed. Trees which are removed must have trunks (base of tree) ground down below the surface of the lawn. Should any lot owner fail to do the above, the District's Board of Trustees may provide for said service at the lot owner's expense after reasonable notice has been given. Any unpaid fee for said service shall become a lien on the property where said service is provided. Painted homes, including awnings and shutters, must be repainted if peeling, fading or resided with a color approved by the Architectural Control Committee.

Please be aware of the above deed restriction. If a lien is required, it is a flat minimum fee of \$575.00.




Most of the owners of the unidentified vehicles in our compounds have been identified. Thank you to all who have helped with this task.






