New law, in effect as of October 1, 2023, golf cart drivers under the age of 18 must be at least 15 with a learner's permit or 16 with a driver's license. Anyone who is 18 or older needs a valid government issued ID.

This change in the law is due to the number of children injured and killed while driving golf carts. Please keep your grandchildren safe and do not allow them to drive your golf cart.



# **AIR FRYER CALZONES**

(Kathy Bachman)

Pillsbury Pizza crust (cut in <sup>1</sup>/<sub>2</sub>, save <sup>1</sup>/<sub>2</sub> for later)

- Spread out flat and put on:
- 1/3 to  $\frac{1}{2}$  C Ricotta cheese





Salt & pepper to taste Any meat you want, sausage, pepperoni, etc.

Fold crust in half and crimp edges.

Fold crimped edges – use fork to seal

Make egg wash (1 egg & 2 tsp water) and brush on Sprinkle with <sup>1</sup>/<sub>4</sub> tsp garlic powder

Make 3 slits on top

Preheat air fryer to 375 degrees (also heat tray)

Cook for 10 minutes.

Let calzone set for 2-3 minutes

Serve with sauce (pizza sauce mixed with parmesan cheese)
